



**Information About Current Social Security Benefits**

Beginning July 1997, the full monthly Social Security benefit before any deductions is \$0.00.

We deduct \$0.00 for medical insurance premiums each month.

The regular monthly Social Security payment is \$0.00.  
(We must round down to the whole dollar.)

Benefits were stopped beginning July 1997.

Social Security benefits for a given month are paid the following month. (For example, Social Security benefits for March are paid in April.)

Your Social Security benefits are paid on or about the third of each month.

**Type of Social Security Benefit Information**

You are entitled to monthly benefits as a dependent of the wage earner.

**Information About Supplemental Security Income Payments**

Beginning May 2011, the current Supplemental Security Income payment is \$0.00.

This payment amount may change from month to month if income or living situation changes.

Supplemental Security Income Payments are paid the month they are due.

(For example, Supplemental Security Income Payments for March are paid in March.)

Payments were stopped beginning May 2011.

We found that you became disabled under our rules on March 3, 2008.

**Type of Supplemental Security Income Payment Information**

You are entitled to monthly payments as a disabled individual.

**Date of Birth Information**

The date of birth shown on our records is November 15, 1981.

**Medicare Information**

You are entitled to hospital insurance under Medicare beginning September 2010.

You are entitled to medical insurance under Medicare beginning September 2010.

Your Medicare number is 2EJ8UV3CE59. You may use this number to get medical services while waiting for your Medicare card.
